Edward L. Simeth Scholarship

Up to \$500 per semester for students enrolled in a Machine Tool Operations Program or Tool & Die Program at any accredited Wisconsin technical college. To qualify, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Applicant must be resident of Wisconsin
- Must complete the top portion of the Application
- Must complete an essay as directed on the application form

Edward L. Simeth scholarships are awarded as funds are available. Students are eligible to apply for the Edward L. Simeth scholarship for each semester. Scholarship awards are paid to the technical college and may only be used for tuition and books. Scholarship awards are based on committee evaluation and approval as well as the availability of funds.

Deadlines for applying:

Spring Semester: JANUARY 15 Fall Semester: JUNE 15

Application Procedures:

Complete the top section of the 'Applicant Information' form and submit it with your essay. Your essay should include why you are interested in precision metalworking, why you chose this occupation and your goals. You may also include any information or special circumstances you wish to be considered when we evaluate your essay (i.e. loss of employment, supporting family members, how this scholarship will assist you). Your essay should be no more than one typed page, single-spaced.
